


TOPLINE SERVICE PERFORMANCE



TOTAL CCTV INCIDENTS BY COUNCIL JULY 2025 – SEP 2025






This chart shows the total number of CCTV incidents split by HDC and Cambridge City Council. The team logged a total of 990 incidents between July '25 and Sept '25, this is a decrease on the previous year's figure – 1093 incidents.



OUT OF HOURS CALL CATEGORIES JULY 2025 – SEP 2025







TOTAL CCTV INCIDENTS LINKED TO HBAC & CAMBAC JULY 2025 – SEP 2025








The chart above shows the number of incidents directly linked to the CAMBAC and HBAC radios. The dark red line shows the total percentage of all incidents recorded.

- Our CCTV Operators regularly achieve fantastic results, we would like to share several highlights captured over the last quarter.
- The following incident write ups include a mx of crime and non-crime across both councils.
- We have experienced some excellent results; from pro-active arrests to tracking down some of our most vulnerable residents; saving lives and preventing crime from the control room.







PRO-ACTIVE INCIDENT – CRIMINAL DAMAGE – ST NEOTS

CAMBRIDGE CITY COUNCIL

Incident 32623 – 20th July 2025 – GB, RS

Criminal Damage Arrest

Operators spotted intoxicated male in St Neots High Street around 05:45, completely covering his face and taking an interest in passersby, prompting observation. The male later pulled a 6" knife and started to stab the tyre of a vehicle on Brook Street. Police were made aware and proceeded to send units to the area. The male caused further damage to another vehicles tyres before jumping over the church wall. Operators located the male on the RDC camera and police arrive and start a foot chase. Tracking the male on the cameras, operators were able to inform police where the male moved onto and was later located and found to have several knives on his person. The male was arrested for x3 criminal damage charges, possession of a bladed article and assault of an emergency worker (this was upon arrest).

The police went on to put out public communications on facebook to identify any other victims of damage to their vehicles.




SHOPLIFTER ARRESTED

Operators had a report through from Sports Direct with regards to a male who had shoplifted some goods from the store with description. Operators deployed cameras and located a male with two shopping bags and changing his clothes in the street. Observations were maintained as the male was looking at his surroundings while walking back towards the shops, Sports Direct confirmed this was the male who had shoplifted, VB made aware, and officers attended and proceeded to chase the male towards the Ring Road where he was detained and arrested for theft.

Knife carrying drug dealer sentenced

A drug dealer caught carrying a Samurai-style knife and class A drugs has been sentenced. Neighbourhood officers were on patrol near Parkside in Cambridge on 21 June when they witnessed Valter Mendes involved in a suspected drug deal.

The 19-year-old fled the scene but was spotted later that day in Christ's Pieces.

Following a short foot chase, officers stopped him on Emmanuel Road, where he was found with 82 wraps of crack cocaine, 15 wraps of heroin, a large knife and £405 in cash.

A search of his home, in Crabtree, Peterborough, uncovered multiple mobile phones and weighing scales, further linking him to drug supply activity.

Further investigations also connected Mendes to a separate incident on 16 June, when CCTV operators spotted him carrying a knife near the Grafton Centre.

At Huntingdon Crown Court on Tuesday (12 August), Mendes was sentenced to two years in prison, suspended for two years, after previously pleading guilty to possession with intent to supply cocaine and heroin, two counts of possession of a knife in a public place, possession of cannabis and possession of criminal property. He must also carry out 150 hours unpaid work.

Detective Constable Samuel Andrews, who investigated, said: "This case highlights the proactive work our neighbourhood teams are doing to tackle drug dealing and knife crime. Carrying weapons and dealing drugs puts lives at risk, and we will continue to target those who bring harm to our communities."



CCTV CAMERA MAP – CAMBRIDGE CITY AS OF SEPTEMBER 2025





CCTV CAMERA MAP – HUNTINGDON & GODMANCHESTER AS OF SEPTEMBER 2025







CCTV CAMERA MAP – ST IVES & HOUGHTON AS OF SEPTEMBER 2025






St Ives Cameras – 110 cameras (including one leisure centres)



CCTV CAMERA MAP – ST NEOTS AS OF SEPTEMBER 2025






St Neots Cameras – 60 cameras



CCTV CAMERA MAP – RAMSEY AS OF SEPTEMBER 2025





CCTV CAMERA MAP – YAXLEY AS OF SEPTEMBER 2025





CCTV CAMERA MAP – STILTON AS OF SEPTEMBER 2025


