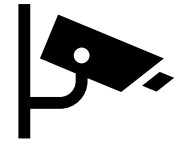

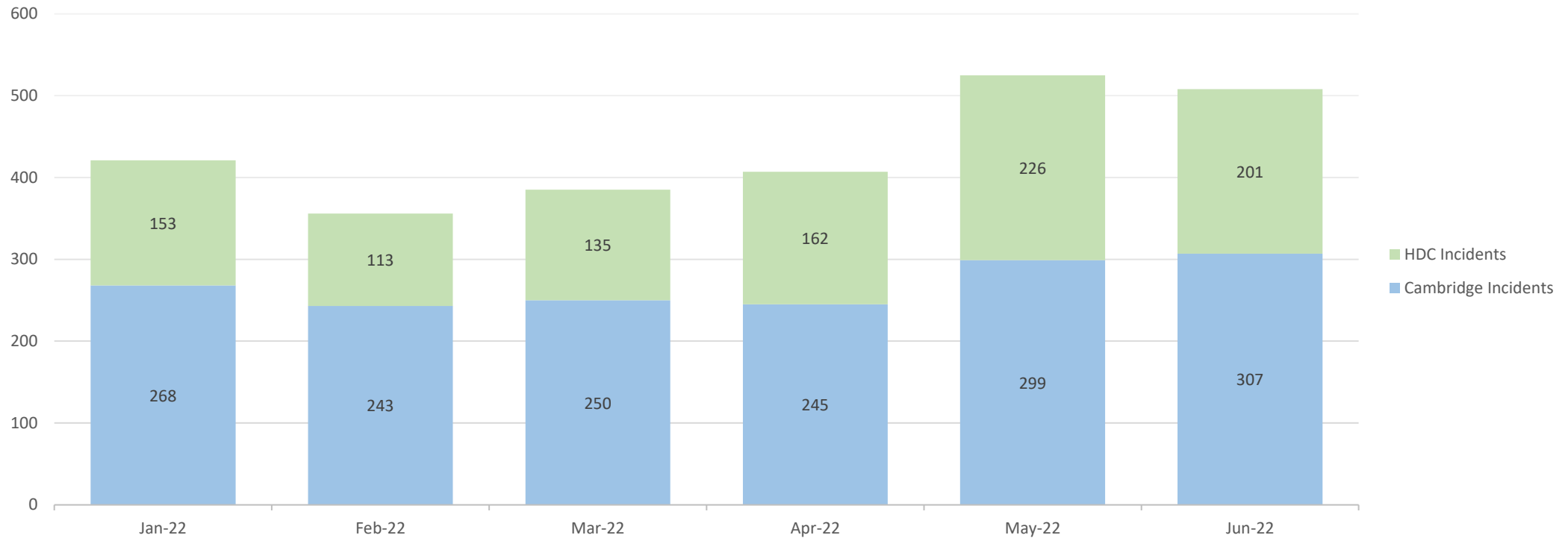

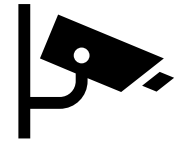
Q1 TOTAL CCTV INCIDENTS BY COUNCIL

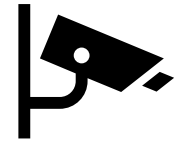

Public welfare continues to be the highest category, consistently making up over 50% of the total figures. The team have recorded 397 public welfare incidents so far this year, compared to 340 in the previous year (a 17% increase).

*Public welfare category includes incidents such as missing person, concern for vulnerable people etc.

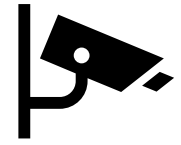

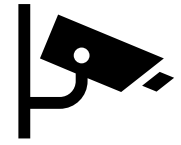

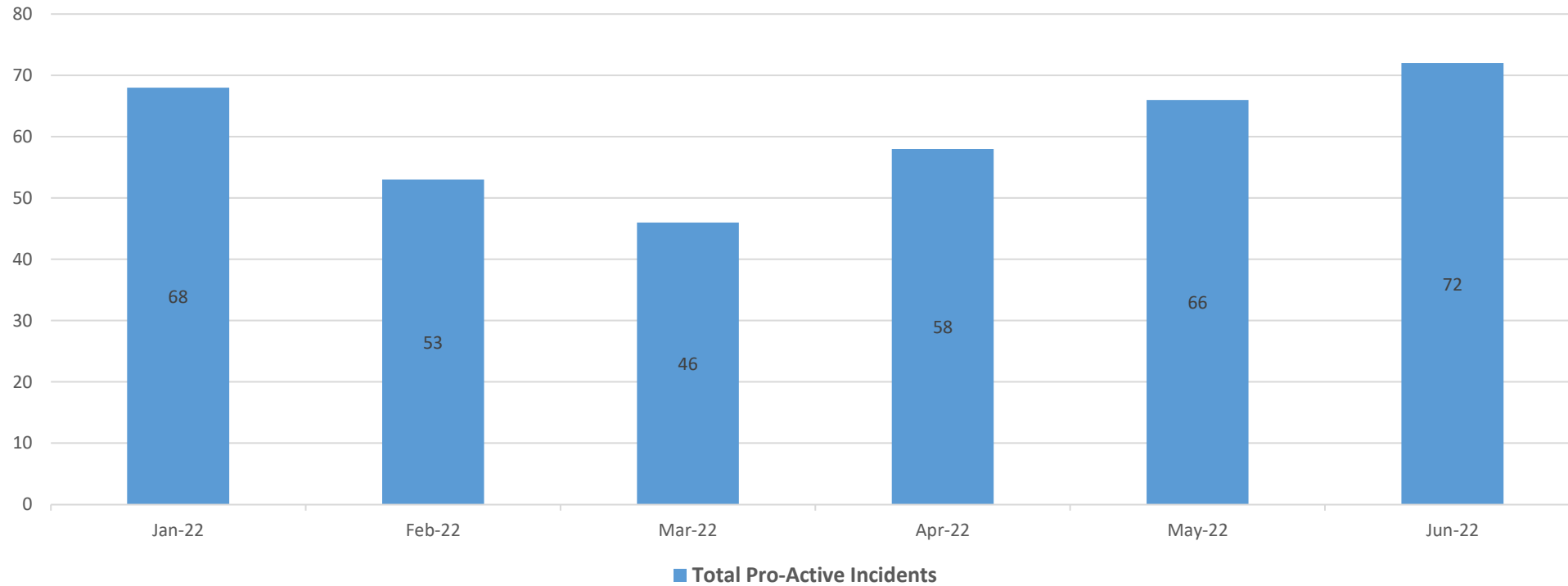

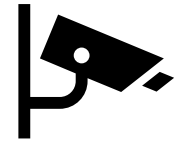

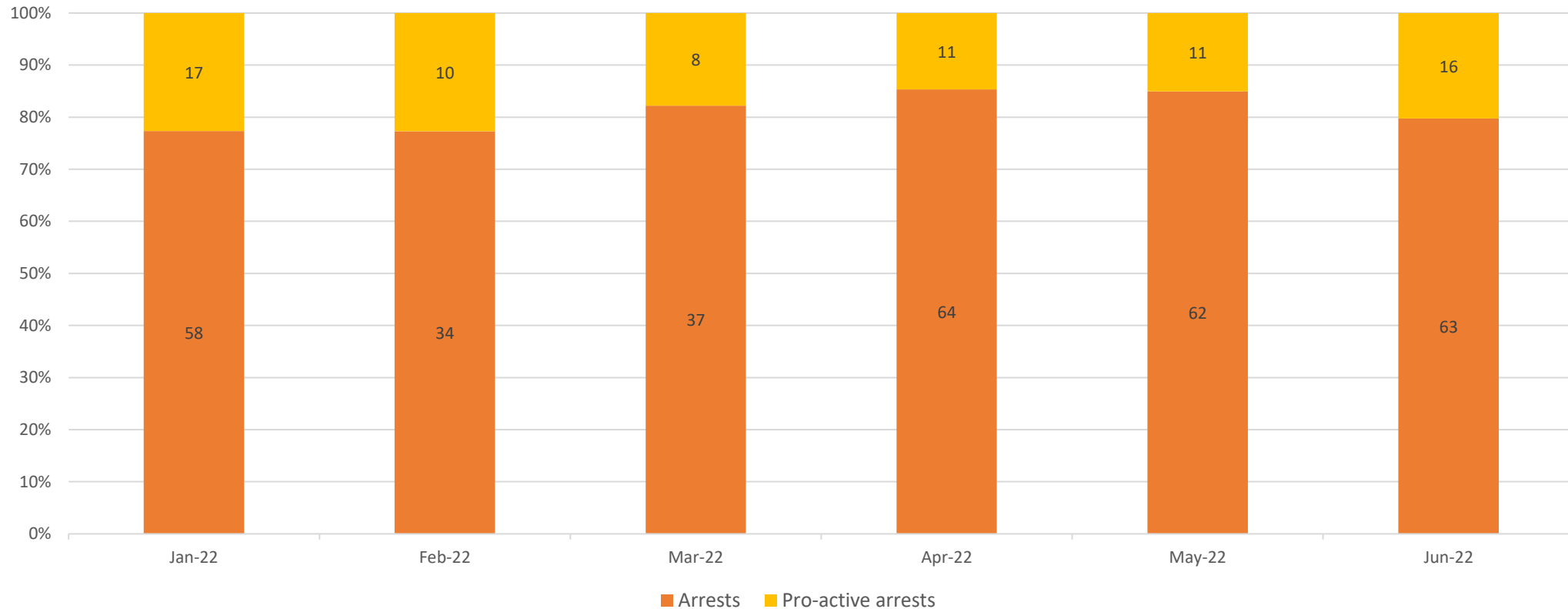
Q1 TOTAL PRO-ACTIVE CCTV INCIDENTS



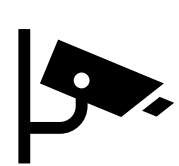
This chart shows the number of pro-active incidents by month. These are incidents where CCTV operators have used their observation skills and training to spot incidents that may have otherwise been missed.

This chart shows the total number of arrests logged on the VTAS system and also the percentage of those arrests that were linked to pro-active incidents. It is worth noting that not all arrests linked to incidents are recorded. This is an area in which our team can improve, better communication between CCTV and police, following up after incidents are closed.



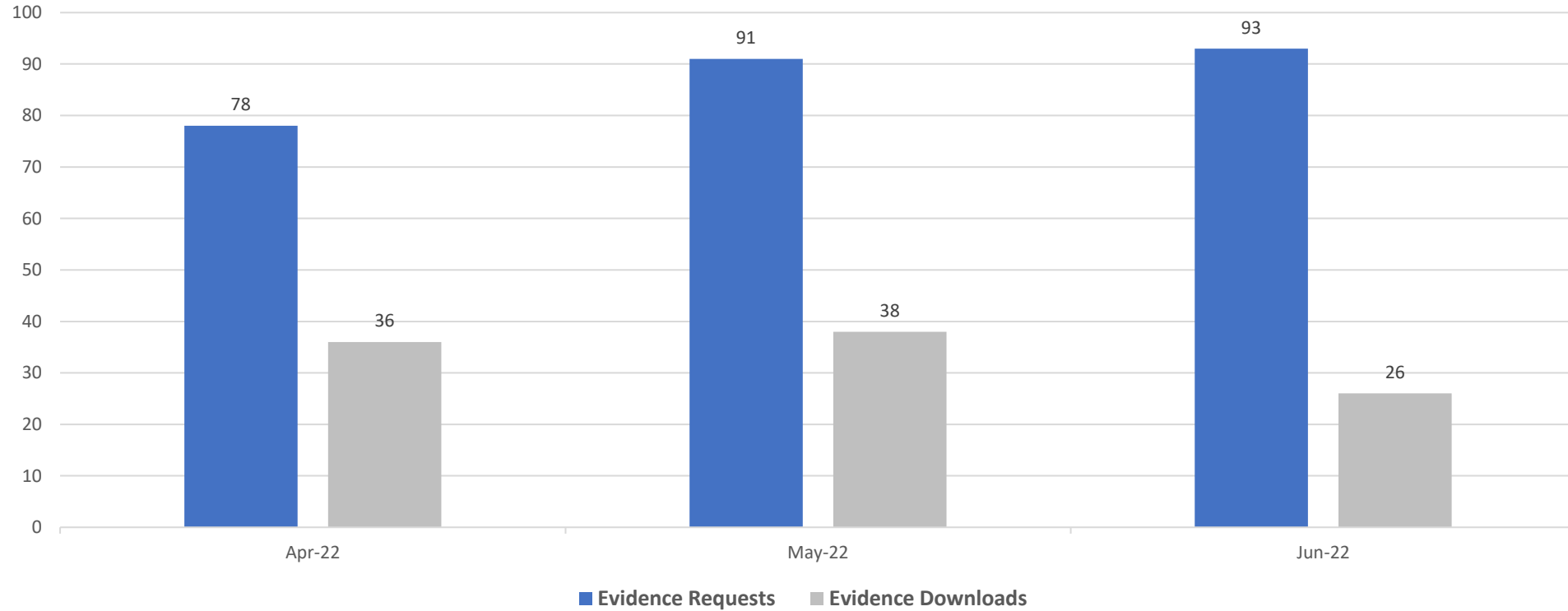
Q1 TOTAL CCTV INCIDENTS LINKED TO HBAC & CAMBAC

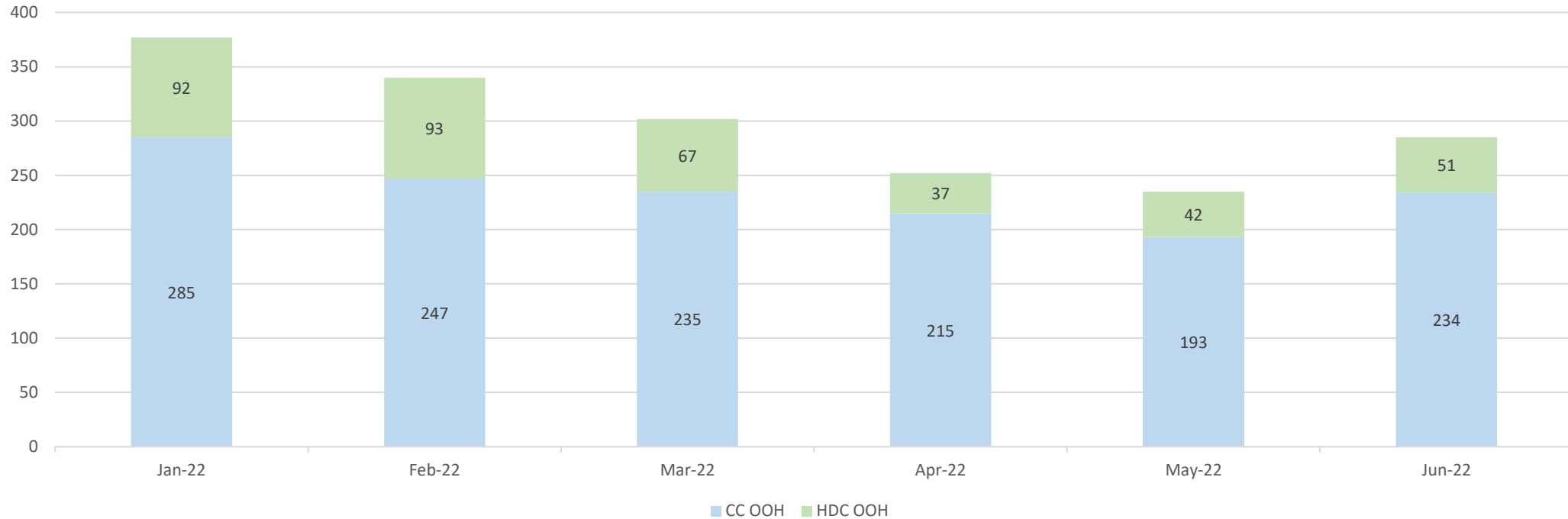
Q1 TOTAL CCTV EVIDENCE REQUEST & DOWNLOADS

Q1 TOTAL OUT OF HOURS CALLS RECEIVED

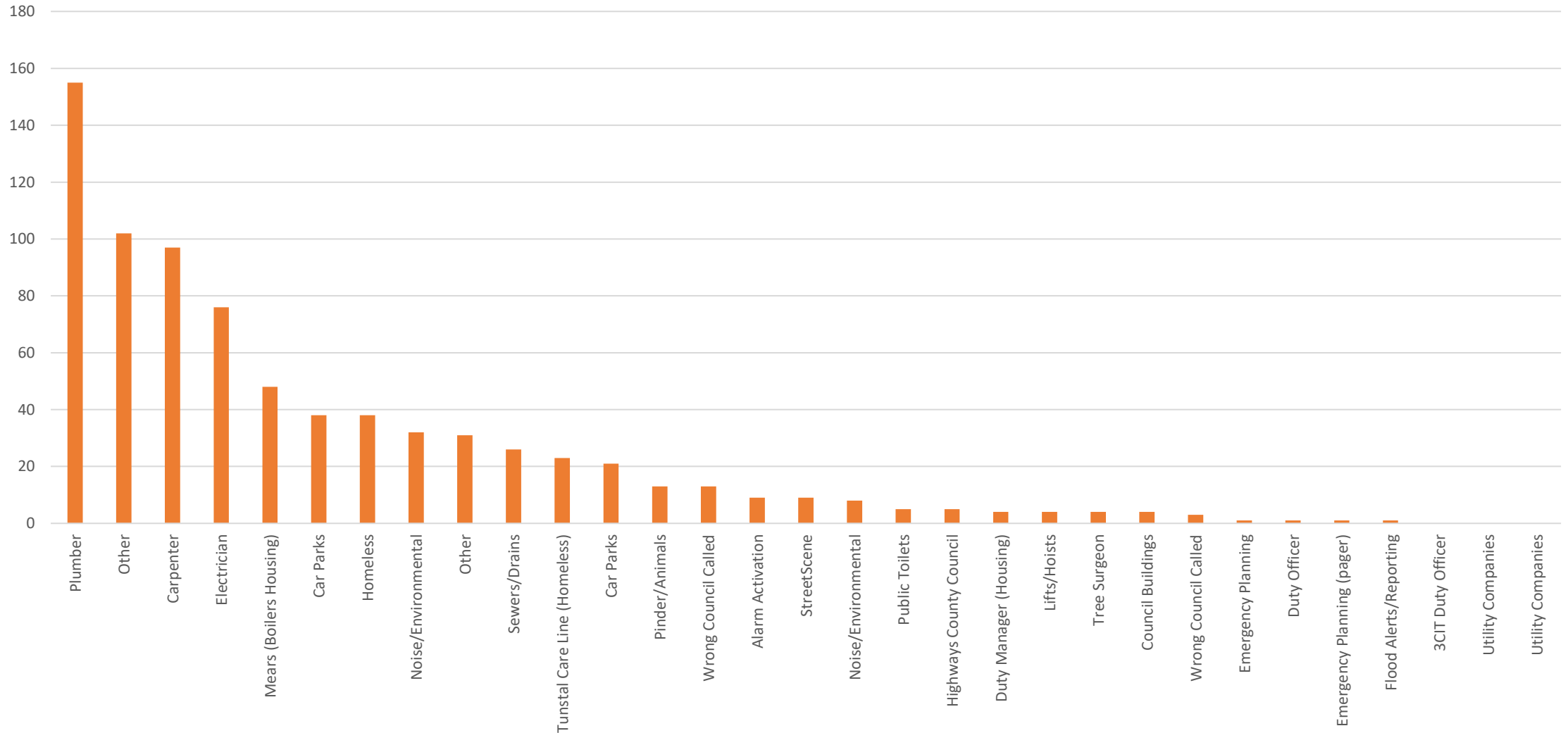


Out of Hours calls have reduced in number since the start of the year, 377 received in January compared to 285 in June, with a dip in April and May.

The calls received are broken down into category on the next slide, as you will see the highest number of calls are regarding Plumbing issues.

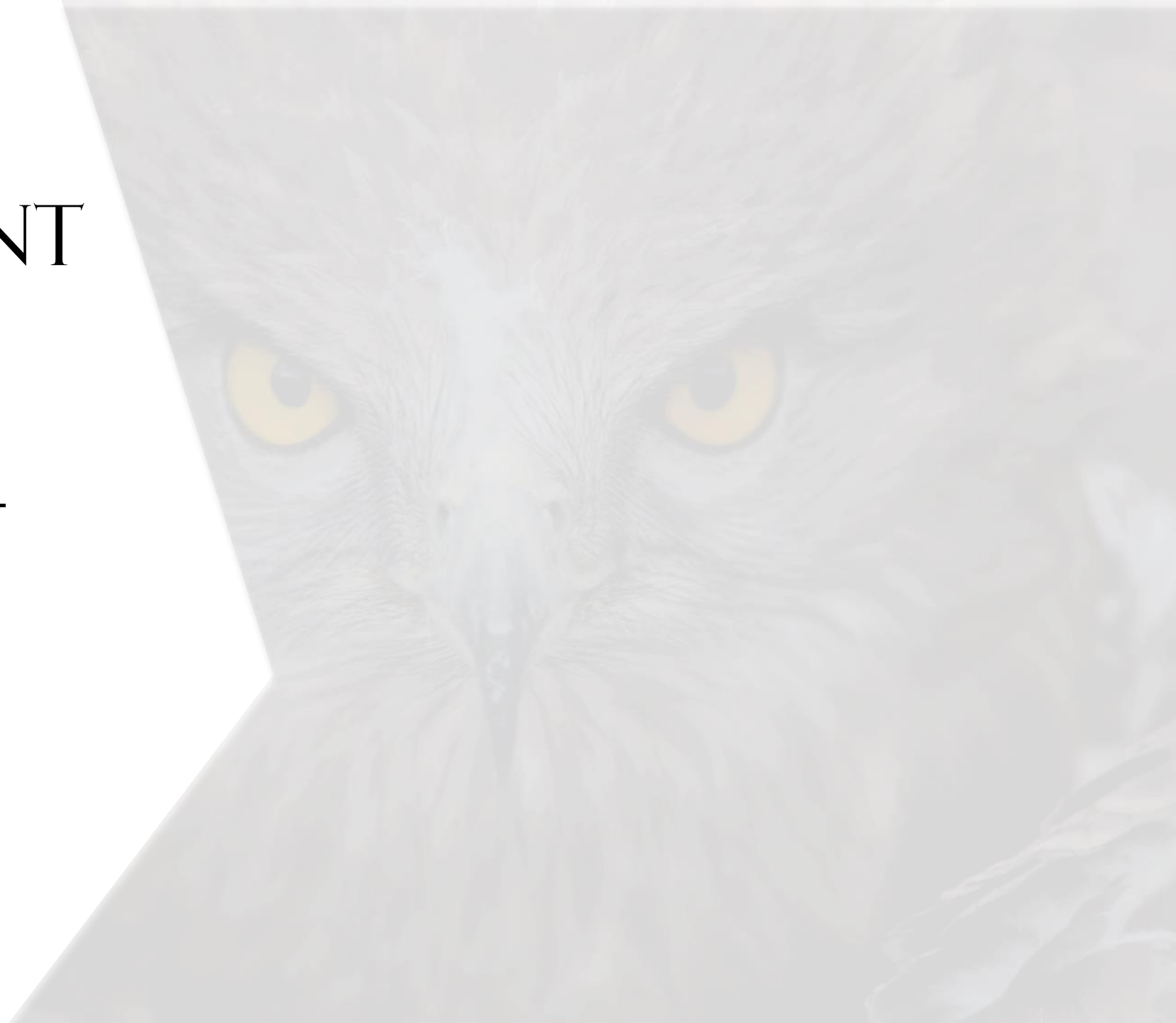
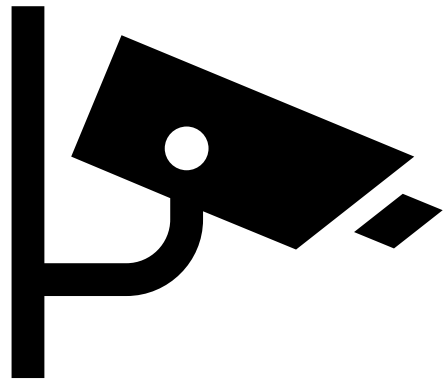


Q1 TOTAL OUT OF HOURS CALL CATEGORIES

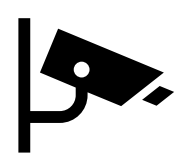

CCTV INCIDENT HIGHLIGHTS

- Our CCTV Operators regularly achieve fantastic results and we would like to share a number of highlights captured over the last quarter.
- The following incident write ups include a mx of crime and non-crime across both councils.
- We have experienced some excellent results; from pro-active arrests to tracking down some of our most vulnerable residents; saving lives and preventing crime from the control room.





OFFENSIVE WEAPON – HUNTINGDON

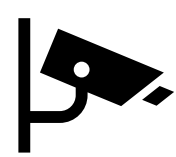


Incident 9505 – 6th April 2022 – MO, MP

FEMALE LOCATED IN POSSESSION OF KNIFE

A call was received from police, reporting a female in the town centre who has been reported to have a knife. Operators took the description and deployed cameras.

Operators searched the area and found a female sitting on a town centre bench, she appeared to be drunk and had blood on her hands and clothes. Police were informed of her location and guided to her location. When they found her she was in possession of several cutlery items as well as a knife, her hands were bleeding heavily. The female was arrested and taken away in a police van to receive medical attention.



REACTIVE ARREST – THEFT – CAMBRIDGE



Incident 9555 – 9TH April 2022– AS, GB

CATALYTIC CONVERTER THIEF ARRESTED

A call was received from police, asking for observations at a city centre car park where a reported catalytic converter theft was in progress.

Operators deployed cameras and could see a car that had been jacked up, they relayed this information to police along with a description of the cars involved and their index numbers.

Observations were maintained as police officers made their way to the scene, a description was taken of the male seen at the scene. When police were nearing the location the male in question ran to his vehicle and started to make his way down the multi storey carpark levels. He stopped on level 5 and was seen exiting the vehicle, and running away on foot. Police officers began chasing the male and eventually caught him a few streets away from the crime scene. He was arrested and taken away in a police van.

PRO-ACTIVE ARRESTS – DRUGS - CAMBRIDGE



Incident 9644 – 15TH April 2022 – MO, MP

DRUG DEALERS ARRESTED

Operators noticed two males at a city centre cash machine, they seemed very aware of the cameras and were acting suspiciously. Observations were maintained as the pair walked around the city centre, at one point one of the males was seen to take something out of his trousers, and a short time after this he was seen ducking down behind a car as if hiding from the cameras.

The male was then seen diving into the rear seat of the car, along with the other male and a third male joined them, getting into the driver seat. Once they were all in the car operators used the cameras to observe a package of white powder being exchanged for money, an obvious drug deal taking place. This information was all relayed to the police via airwaves and officers were deployed.

Officers arrived, the male who had been seen buying the drugs ran away and managed to lose the officers who chased him. The other 2 males were arrested and found to be in possession of drugs and imitation firearms.

This pro-active arrest is a great example of operators using their intuition and spotting people who are acting suspiciously – a great result.


CONCERN FOR FEMALE

Operators spotted a female walking towards the town centre bridge, as it was the early hours of the morning and she was alone they decided to maintain observations.

As the operators watched the female cross the bridge, she stopped and climbed over the railings, police were informed and officers were immediately despatched. The bridge was closed off at both ends and several police units arrived on scene. Paramedics also arrived on scene and fire brigade were put on standby.

After police officers spoke with the female for a while she climbed back over the railings and was then led to an ambulance.

This proactive work from the team potentially saved a life on this occasion, a fantastic result.


LARGE GROUP OF MALES ARRESTED FOR FIGHTING

Operators received a call via the CAMBAC radio, it was from a city centre night club, reporting a large fight outside their premises. Cameras were deployed and police were immediately informed.

Observations were maintained on the group and shared to the police feed, operators could see 3 males within the group using belts and trying to assault people with them. Descriptions were taken of what appeared to be the main offenders.

First officers arrive on scene and try to separate the group, one male is arrested and others leave the scene and make their way up the road. One of these males is seen grabbing a glass bottle and throwing it back in the direction of the police officers.

Observations continued as the group moved its way across the city centre, splitting up and then gathering again, continuing to fight each other using belts. Police gradually catch up with the group and further arrests are made, 7 in total!



PROACTIVE ARREST – BIKE THEFT – CAMBRIDGE



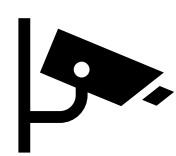
Incident 10169 – 16TH May 2022 – CJ, MO

BIKE THIEF ARRESTED

Operators spotted a male trying to force the lock off an expensive bicycle locked up in the city centre. He was seen removing the lock and then stealing the bike, cameras were deployed and observations were maintained, police were informed. The suspect stopped to talk to someone and his identity was confirmed, he was a known bike thief and had been arrested in the past, this information was relayed to police and observations continued.

Police arrive at the scene, confirm the identity of the male who had specific court orders not to be with a bike unless he could prove it was his and not to have tools that could be used to steal bikes. He was arrested and taken away in a police van.

A great example of proactiveness, and a bike thief stopped in his tracks!



REACTIVE ARREST– DRUGS – ST NEOTS

MALE ARRESTED IN POSSESSION OF DRUGS

Operator overheard a mobile police unit speaking with VB over the airwaves, they described a male they were looking for and the last known location.

Cameras were deployed and the operator quickly spotted a male that fitted the description, this information was given to the police and officers soon arrived on scene. The male was searched and then arrested, he was found to have class A drugs in his possession.



REACTIVE ARREST – ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR – HUNTINGDON



Incident 10624 – 8th June 2022 – AW, CJ, MP

MALE ARRESTED FOR ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR

Operators observed a group of four youths surrounding street drinkers in Huntingdon town centre, one of the youths appeared to start kicking one of the street drinkers who was sat on the grass.

Police were made aware of the situation and observations continued. One of the group was then seen to pick up dirt/stones and throw it at the street drinkers, he appeared to be the main offender and his description was given to police.

Officers arrived on scene in an unmarked vehicle, when the youths saw officers they ran in separate directions but operators assisted in tracking down the main offender, he was caught and arrested.



REACTIVE ARREST – OFFENSIVE WEAPON - CAMBRIDGE



Incident 10623 – 8th June 2022 – CJ, AW, MP

MALE ARRESTED FOR CARRYING A KNIFE

Operators received a call over the airwaves from police, reporting a male walking around the city centre with a knife. A clear description was taken and cameras were deployed.

The male in question was located almost immediately, outside a city centre shop. Police were informed of his location and observations were maintained. The male started walking away from the shops just as officers arrived, they intercepted the male and he was arrested.

This was quick work by the operators and police, a potentially very dangerous incident was prevented.

REACTIVE ARREST – OFFENSIVE WEAPON – CAMBRIDGE



Incident 10617 – 8th June 2022 – CJ, AW, MP

MALE WITH LARGE KNIFE LOCATED AND ARRESTED

A call was received via police airwaves, operators were asked to look out for a male who had run out of his youth hostel and was reported to have a knife. His description was taken and cameras were deployed, although there are not many cameras in the area where he was last seen.

Moments later, the operator searching for the male spotted someone who fit the description, he immediately informed police and nearby officers were alerted and made their way to the location. The male in question was walking with purpose, he looked agitated and appeared to be searching for someone, the operator took a closer look and could see a knife tucked into his waistband. This information was passed to police.

Officers quickly arrived on the scene and the male ran down a street off camera, thankfully he was soon caught and brought back to the police vehicle where he was arrested. The knife he had been carrying was a long, machete style knife. This could have resulted in very serious injuries and a potentially deadly incident was prevented due to the keen eye of our operators and the rapid police response.

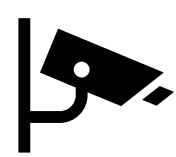
MISSING TEENAGERS LOCATED

Operators overheard a police officer call over the airwaves, he believed he had seen two missing females who had gone missing from a secondary school over 24 hours ago.

Cameras were deployed to the location they had been spotted and they could be seen running across a meadow, towards the main road. This information was passed to police over the airwaves, and observations continued until they went off of camera.

The females were later seen in a similar location, cameras were deployed and the operator spotted them running across the main road and hiding behind a fence. Police officers arrived at the scene moments later and caught up with the females before they could run off again.

They were safely escorted into a police van and driven home.



REACTIVE INCIDENT – THEFT – HUNTINGDON

GROUP OF SHOPLIFTERS APREHENDED

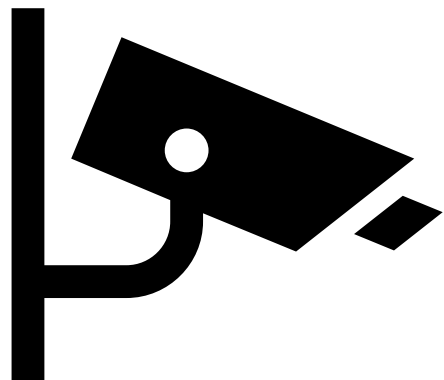
Operators received a call from a town centre premises via the HBAC radio. They had deterred a group from stealing £150 of items, their descriptions were taken and cameras were deployed.

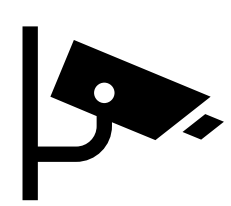
Soon after, the group were spotted walking through the town centre. Operators continued to observe the group as they split up and went into different premises, always coming out with different items, which were suspected to be stolen. Eventually they were seen exiting a shoe shop, carrying several pairs of shoes and then leaving the location and heading to the bus station. Police were informed of this over the airwaves and officers were dispatched. They caught up with the group and finally stopped them after they were seen throwing stolen items over a wall.

They were questioned and then taken away in a police car.

Knife-wielding man jailed

A man seen wielding a knife around Cambridge city centre has been jailed.

Nathan Cassidy, 31 of Elizabeth Way, Cambridge, was spotted waving the kitchen knife towards members of the public by security staff outside a nightclub in the early hours of 1 May.

Security officers alerted CCTV operators so Cassidy could be followed safely until police arrived.

Cassidy was arrested in Hobson Street and the knife was found discarded nearby.

At Cambridge Magistrates Court on Tuesday (10 May), Cassidy was sentenced to six months in prison after pleading guilty to possession of a knife in a public place and affray.

PC Peter Lloyd said: "Thanks to partnership working between the nightclub, CCTV operators and police, Cassidy was apprehended quickly, and the knife removed from the streets.

"It is illegal to carry a knife like this and due to the seriousness of his actions, Cassidy has been jailed.

"Some people think that carrying a knife provides them with protection. What it actually does is put them, their friends and family in danger and increase the chances of someone being hurt."

Court extends CBO and jails prolific bike thief

A prolific thief has been jailed after he was caught on CCTV stealing a bike.

CCTV operators in Cambridge captured John Bruce Miller as he forced a bike from the railings. It was attached to in Sidney Street and dispose the broken lock in a nearby bin at about 2.50am on Monday (16 May).

Officers caught up with Miller and retrieved the bike and lock.

At Cambridge Magistrates' Court on Tuesday (17 May), Miller, 38, of New Street, pleaded guilty to bike theft and breaching a Criminal Behaviour Order (CBO) that he was given in April last year (2021) not to:

- Be in possession of any pedal cycle or any cycle part without a verifiable receipt.
- Be in possession of any item that can be used to steal a pedal cycle in a public place.

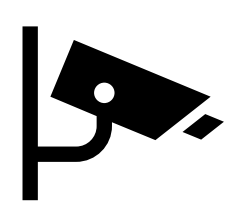
He was sentenced to 16 weeks in prison and his CBO was extended by a further two years.

Inspector Ed McNeill said: "Miller is a prolific bike thief in Cambridge with numerous convictions against his name for cycle theft.

"We're working hard to address cycle crime in Cambridge. This includes reviewing and identifying bike-theft hotspots, catching offenders, recovering stolen bikes with proactive patrols and education.

"All reports of bike theft are taken seriously and we would encourage people to report offences so we can build up a picture and deploy resources accordingly."

Jail for man who instigated violent disorder in St Ives

A man who instigated a violent disorder in the centre of St Ives has been jailed.

CCTV operators captured the moment 18-year-old Charlie Wilson lead a group of people to Crown Place on 13 October last year to launch an attack on another group of people.

Wilson carried out the first punch before the fight fully broke out.

During the 20 second brawl Wilson was stabbed with a large kitchen knife to the leg before everyone ran from the scene.

Through CCTV footage officers were able to identify Wilson and other members of the group. A bag of blood stained clothes were found bagged up outside Wilson's home and the kitchen knife was found discarded in a wheelie bin in Crown Walk.

At Peterborough Crown Court on Friday (29 April), Wilson, of Lake Gardens, Dagenham, Greater London, was sentenced to 14 months in a young offenders institute after previously pleading guilty to possession of class B drugs and violent disorder.

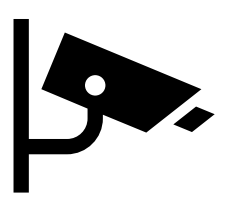
The teenager pleaded guilty to possession of an offensive weapon at court and was given 12 month youth rehabilitation order.

Due to this the male was promptly arrested by officers, and a large knife was recovered.

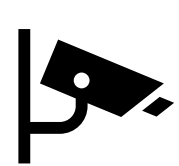

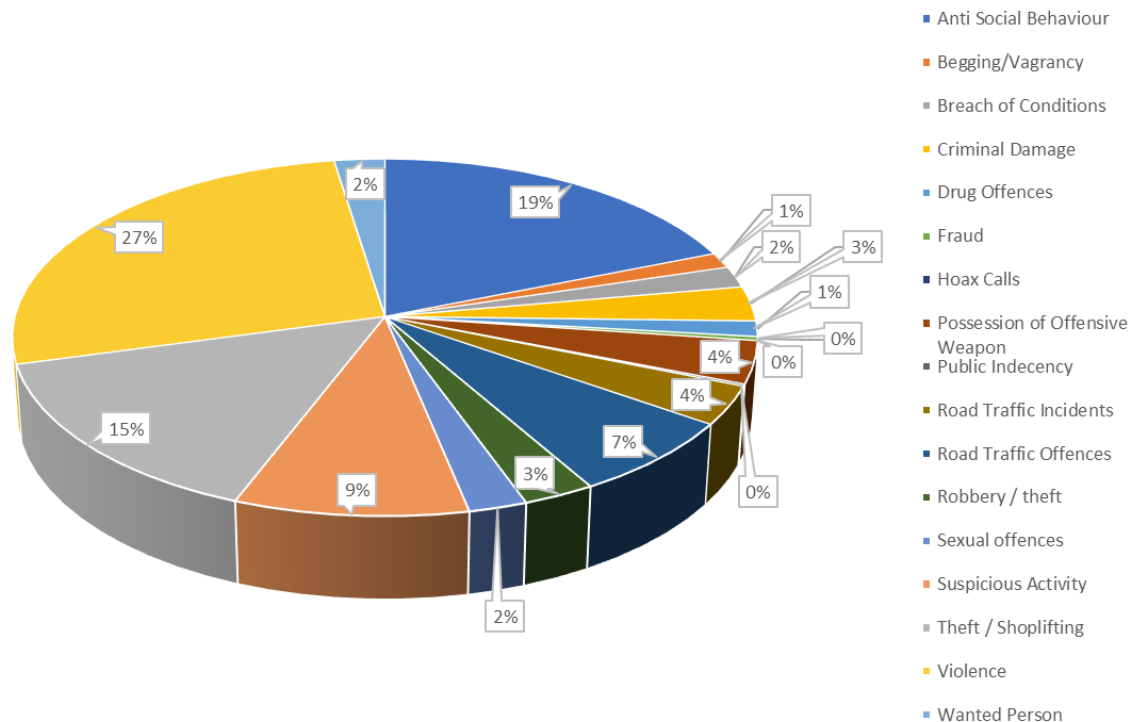




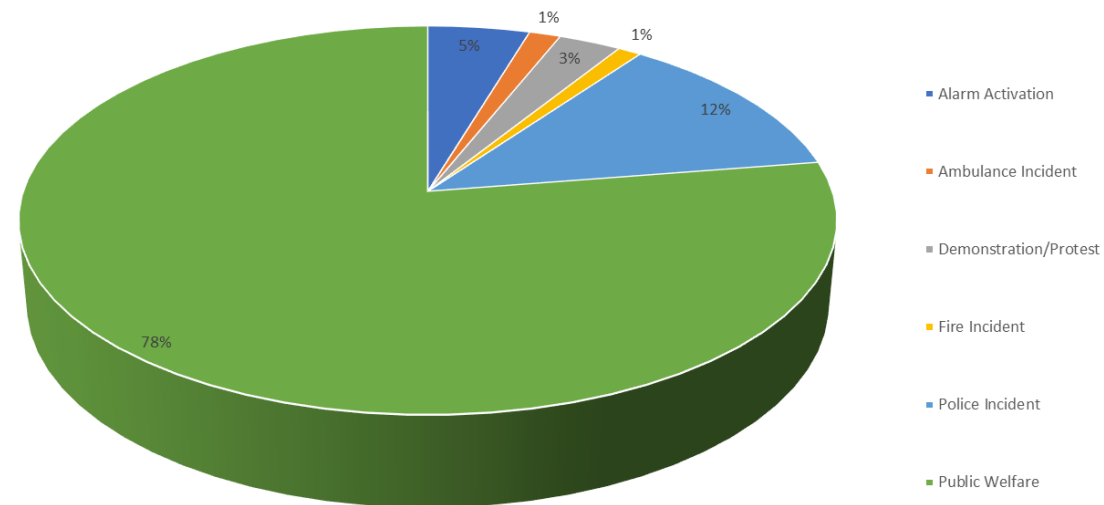
Q1 TOTAL INCIDENTS BY CATEGORY – CAMBS CITY



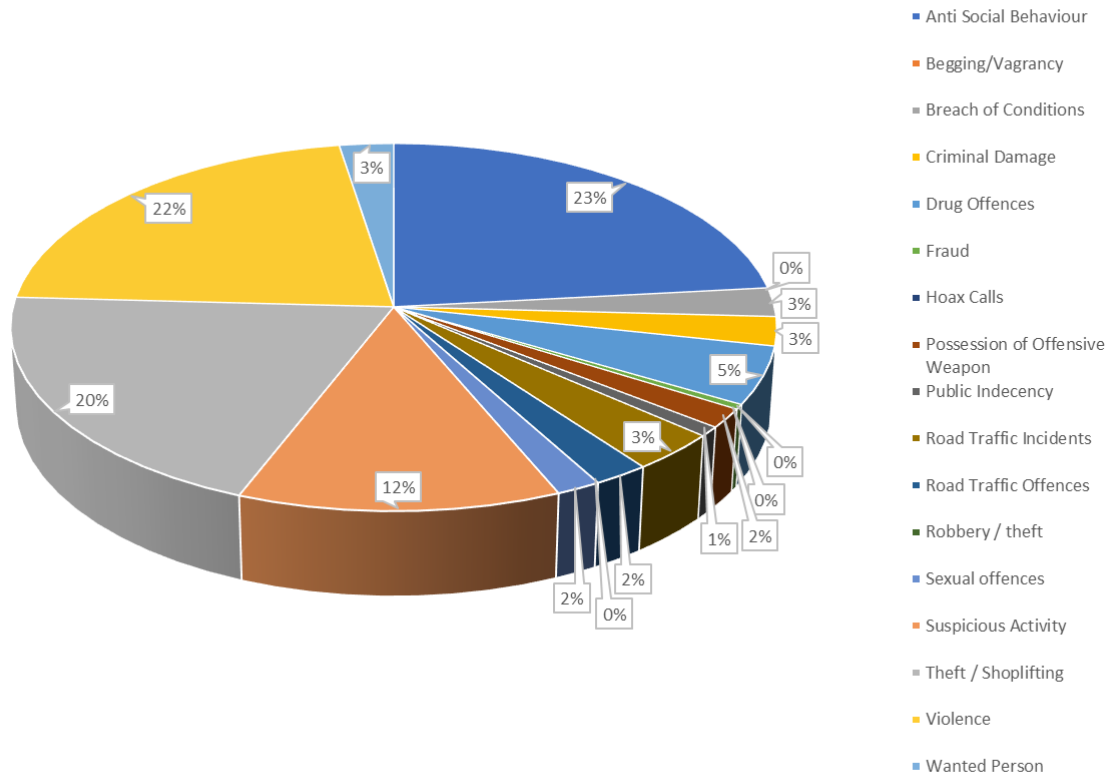
Crime Incidents in Cambs City - April to June 2022



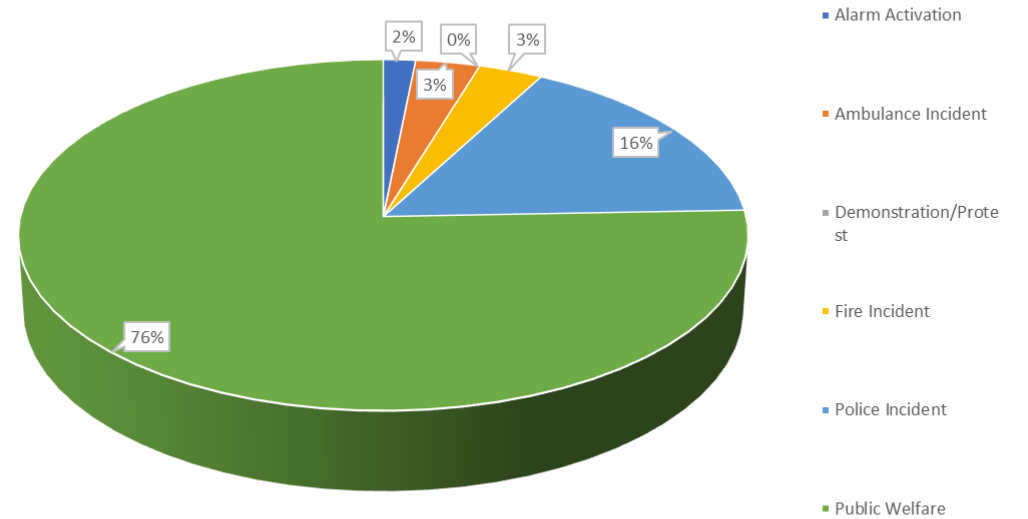
Non-Crime Incidents in Cambs City - April to June 2022

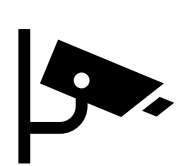


Crime Incidents in Huntingdon - April to June 2022



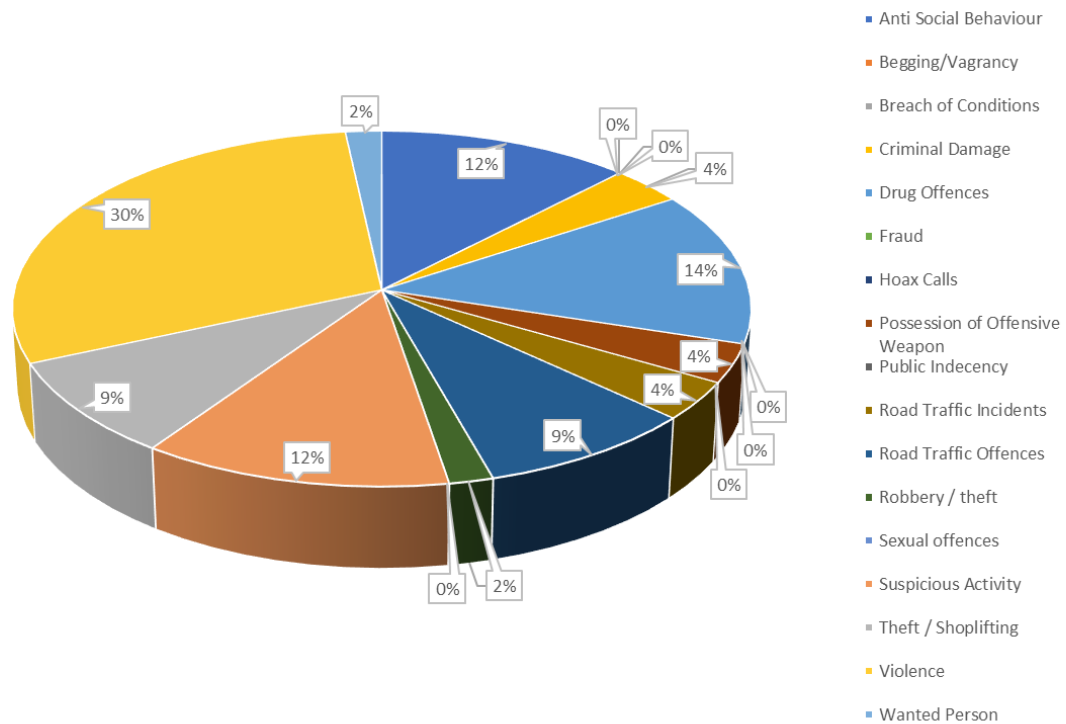

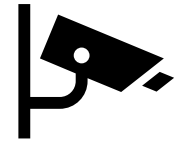


Crime Incidents in St Ives - April to June 2022



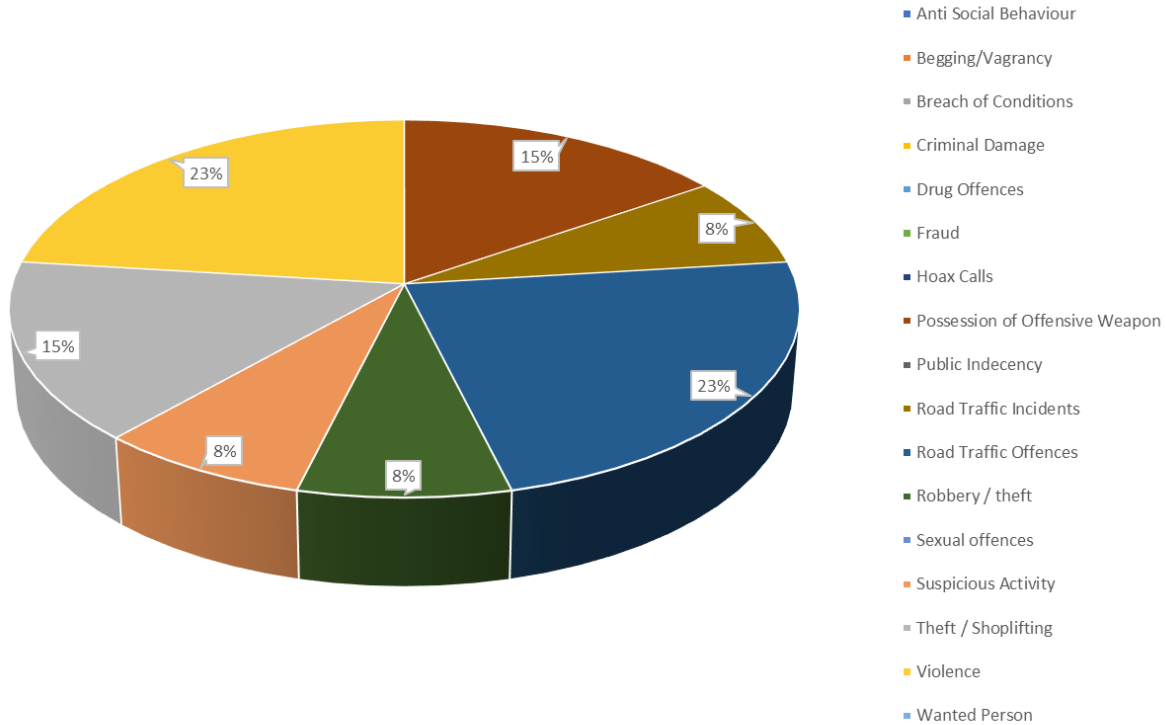

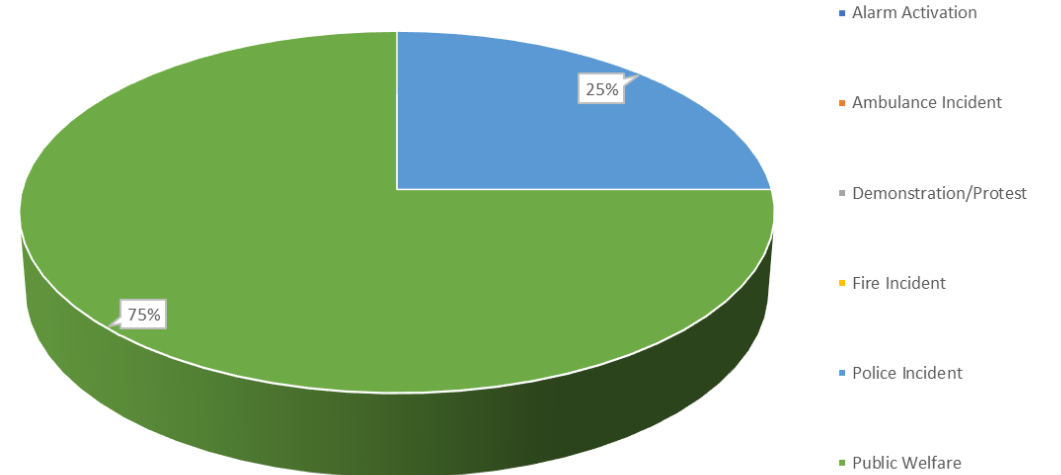


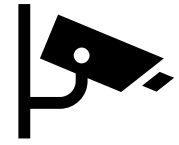
Q1 TOTAL INCIDENTS BY CATEGORY – RAMSEY

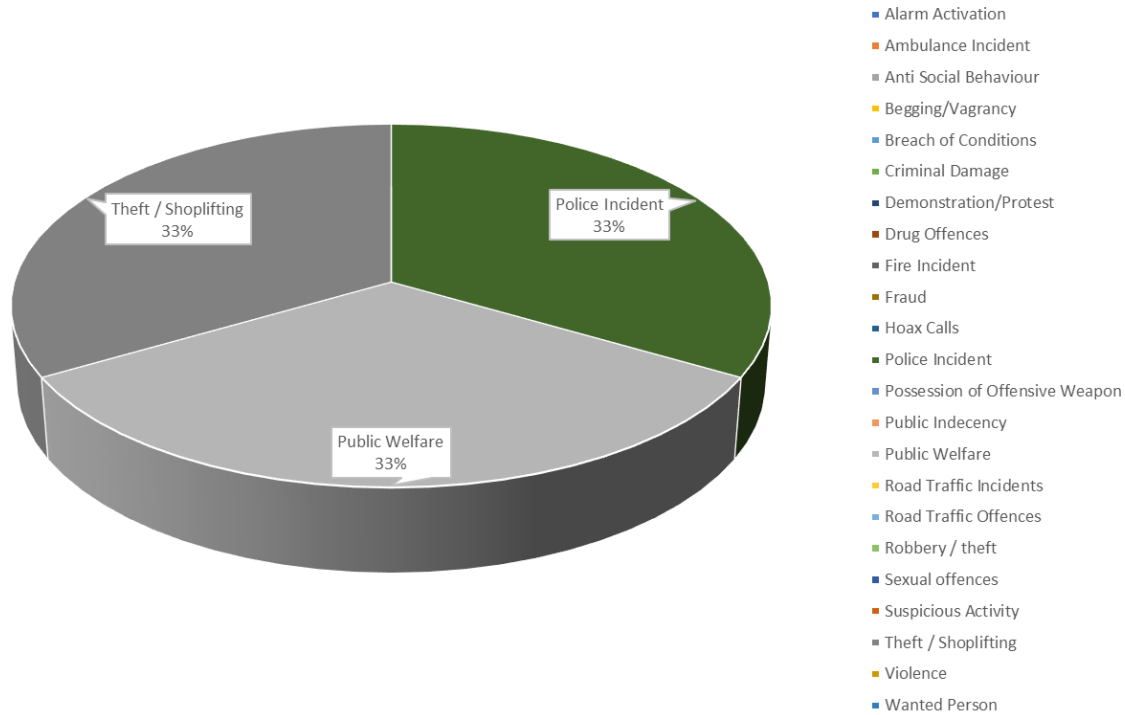




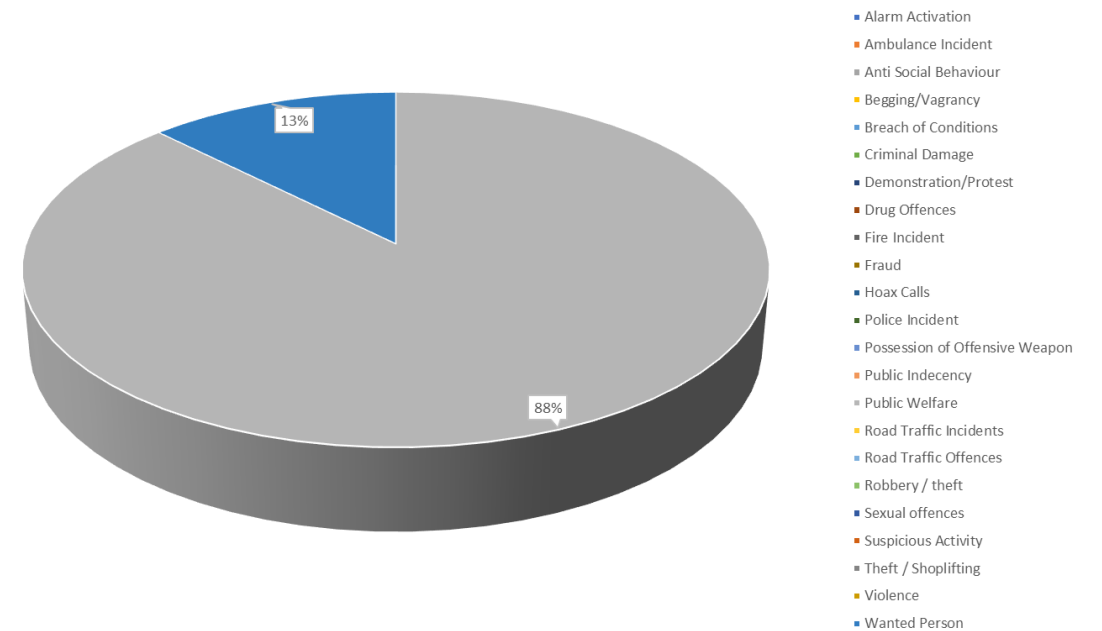

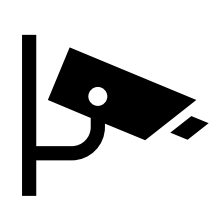

15 new cameras have been installed in Huntingdon Multi-Storey Carpark, bringing the total numbers in HDC to 238 cameras.

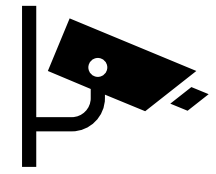

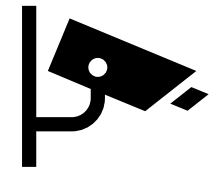




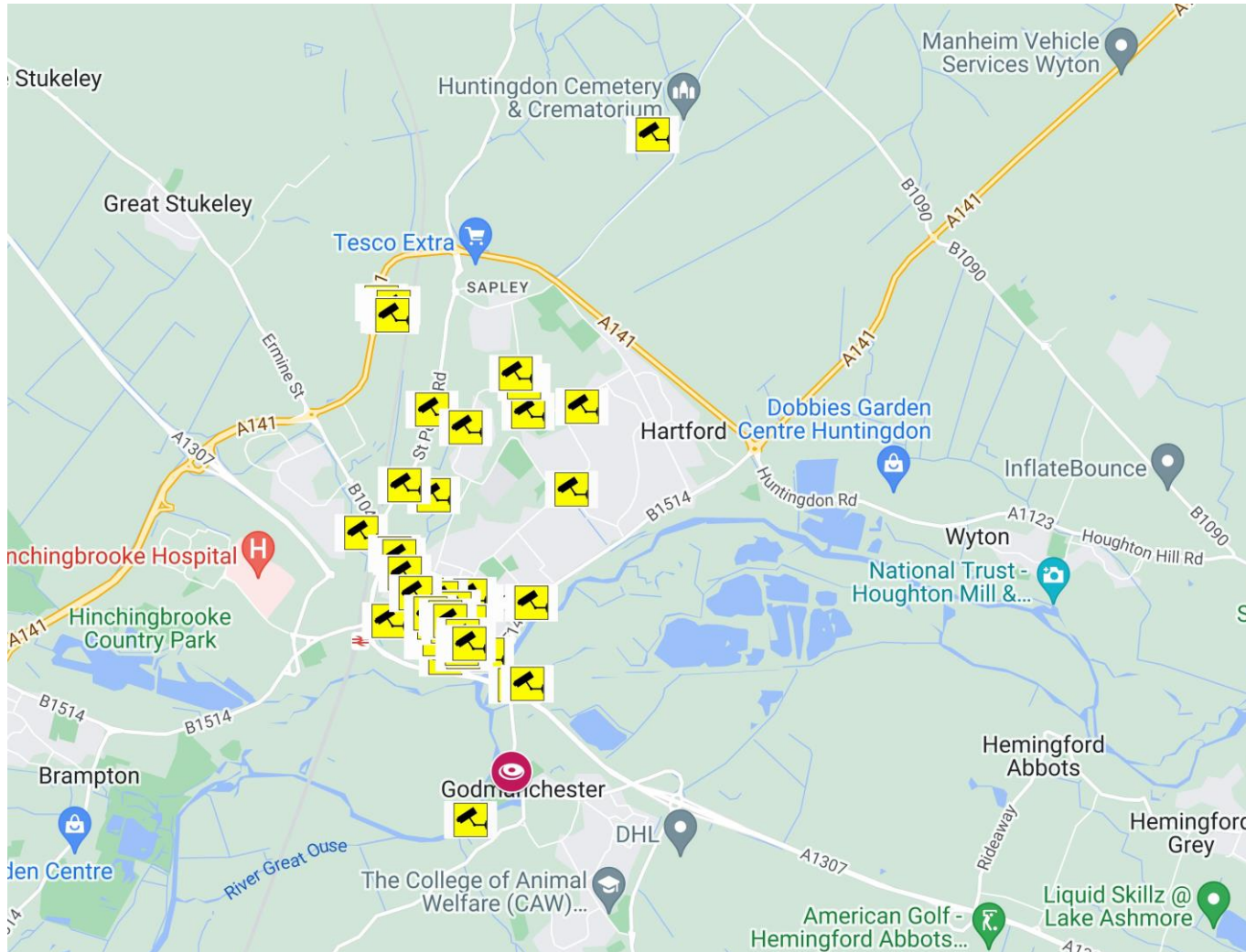
CCTV CAMERA MAPS (AS OF JUNE 2022)



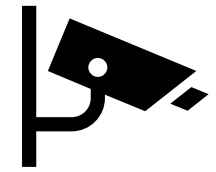

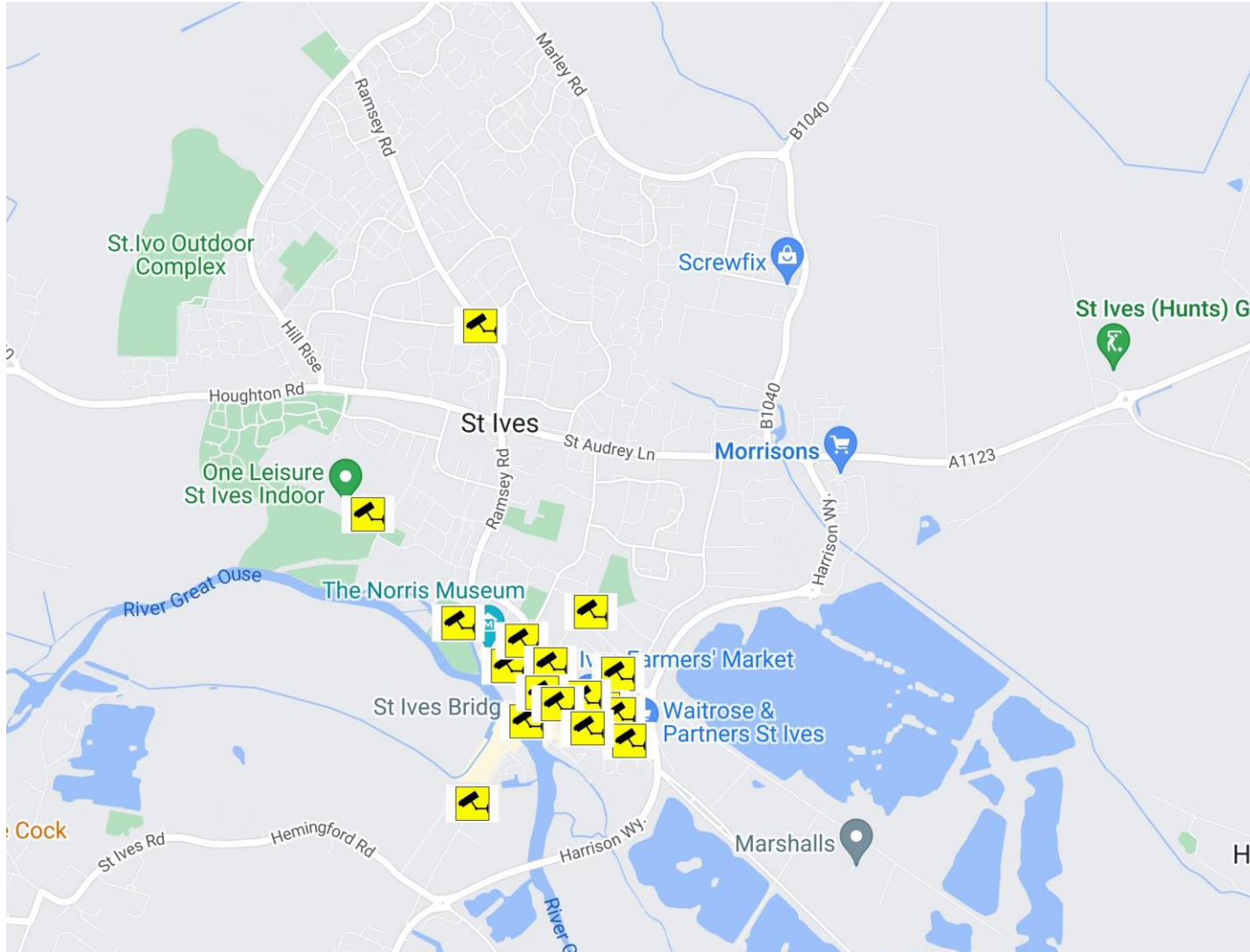
CCTV CAMERA MAPS (AS OF JUNE 2022)



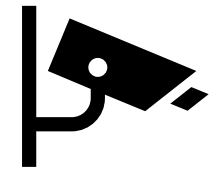

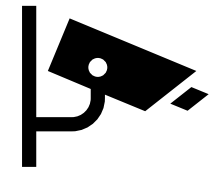
St Neots Cameras – 25 cameras

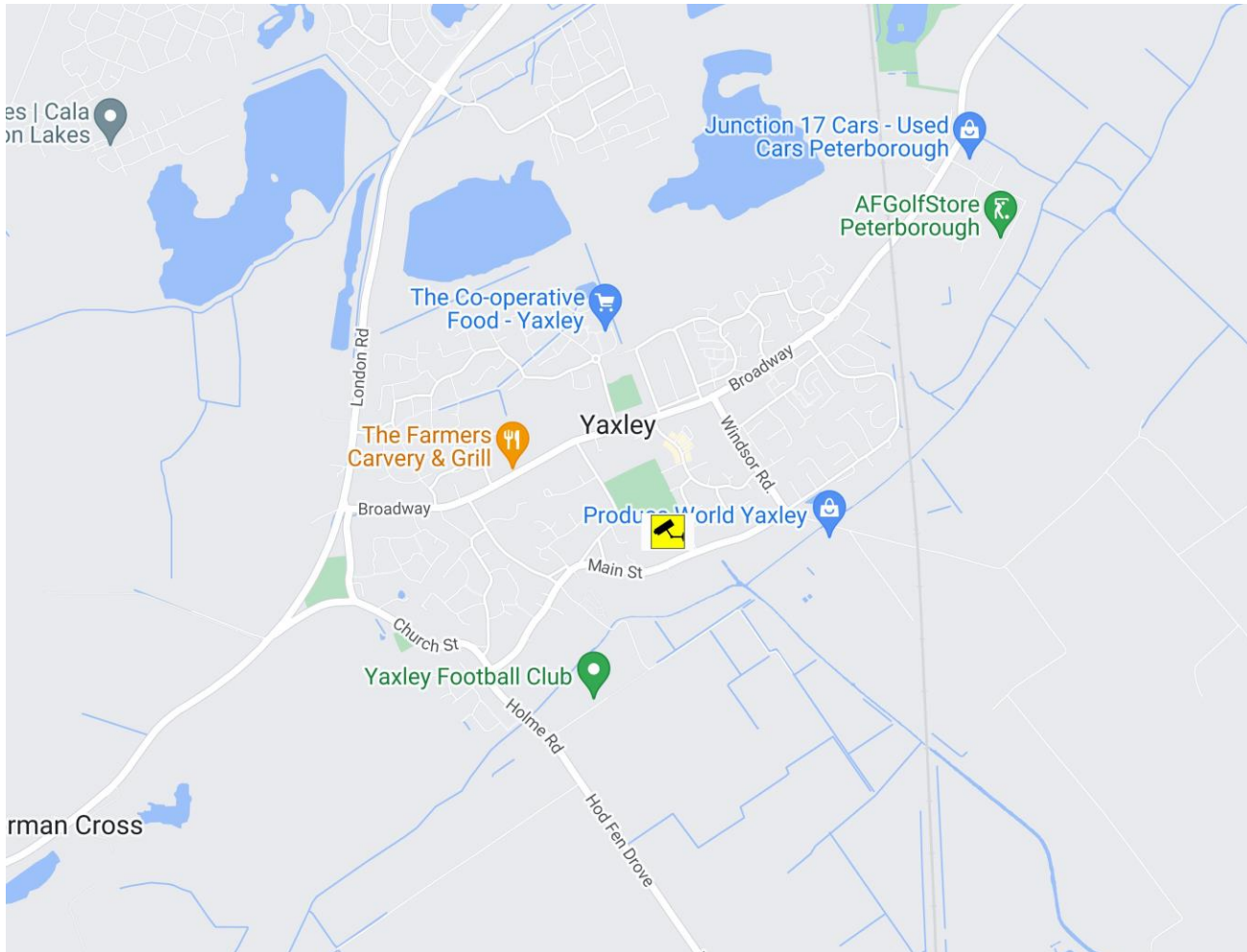

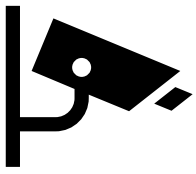
