




# TOTAL CCTV INCIDENTS BY COUNCIL OCTOBER 2025 – DECEMBER 2025



The incidents are split into crime/non-crime and by zone in the next slides.




# TOTAL CCTV INCIDENTS: CRIME VS NON-CRIME % SPLIT OCTOBER 2025 – DECEMBER 2025

















# TOTAL CCTV INCIDENTS LINKED TO HBAC & CAMBAC OCTOBER 2025 – DECEMBER 2025



# RE-ACTIVE ARREST – THEFT & POSSESSION OF WEAPON – CAMBRIDGE



## **TWO MALES ARRESTED FOR THEFT & POSSESSION OF WEAPON**

Whilst monitoring airwaves, CCTV operators heard police trying to send a unit to an intruder alarm. Operators watched a playback of the location detailed to see if anything could be seen. Two males could be seen in a doorway before leaving and going off camera, further playback on 2207 gave a good description of clothing and details passed onto police. Operators continued to watch playback footage and tracked the two males, later spotting them with two females entering the grand arcade car park. Police informed and both males arrested by an ARV team with one male covered in broken glass and blood. It is believed that the males emptied the till and stole whiskey.

CCTV operators assisted with incident from first picking up on airwaves to arrest was approximately 30 minutes.



## **SHOPLIFTING ARREST**

Operators had report from TK Maxx with regards to a male who has stolen from the store and given description of male.

Cameras were deployed and located the male walking with a female, being followed by security and stopped outside of the council offices by police. Reports of goods being stored in a car located outside Sainsburys and police brought the female to the car. The car was searched, good located, the male arrived back at the retail park and was then arrested in connection to the theft. Goods recovered and observations ended.

## X6 ARRESTED FOR SHOPLIFTING

Report from Townrow with regards to a theft with location a descriptions of 6 individuals, believing the group have stolen items including a medium length carving knife.


Cameras were deployed to the location described and located the group leaving the location after being aggressive with other members of the public. Operators followed the individuals on cameras and kept VB aware of locations and movements as the group split up. PSCOs stopped the car described by CCTV operators, officers stated the car smelt like cannabis, the male in the car ran from officers.

CCTV operators made police aware of the other individual's locations, resulting in police detaining two females and confirmed that had discarded stolen items in bushes.

One male was later detained by a dog unit, the male was placed in handcuffs by an ununiformed officer, searched but nothing found.

The car was also searched and further stolen items from other stores such as Superdrug, Peacocks and Boots were identified.

All six individuals were arrested and vans requested, male with officers outside of Greggs was taken in a car, all left, observations ended.


## **VIOLENT MALE ARRESETED**

Request to look at location for a male arguing with a female and becoming violent. Male identified and cameras deployed to observe male.

CCTV operators observed male walking around town becoming increasingly angry and talking to himself, VB asked if operators were watching him and operators advised he is on their live feed.

The male then turned onto George Street and started to walk in the middle of the road hand gesturing at vehicles, police on route. Officers arrived at scene and took him to the floor, upon search they discovered a knife on his possession and was placed under arrest. A van arrived and the male was taken into custody. The market officer approached police officers and informed them the male was seen punching a food van earlier which caused damage. Playback also showed the male attempting to steal a scooter from the entrance of Superdrug, with the owner approaching him and pushing him away, he did not take the scooter.

Once all police officers had left, CCTV observations ended.


## ARREST FOR THEFT AND TRAFFIC OFFENCES

Operators received a radio message from police for observations on a white van, believed to be involved in a theft of cooking oil from a St Neots pub.

CCTV operators located the van and details passed to police. Operators followed the van and caught individuals in the van stealing oil from a property, as the van pulled out into traffic a lone PCSO ran after it, taking the keys out and stood talking to two males.

Both males ran away in different directions, CCTV operators tracked both males, police later arrived resulting in two arrests for theft of cooking oil and various traffic offences.

Males were believed to be involved in multiple thefts of oil, with 9 drums of oil recovered by police in the van.

## DRINK DRIVER ARRESTED


CCTV operators received a call from the Swan and Angel, informing that a male had left the pub after consuming 4 or 5 pints and they believe he was going to drive. Operators were aware this male has been banned from driving through close work with HBAC.


Operators alerted police and tracked the male to his car, location details provided to police as the male drove off. Various units responded and the male was stopped by officers and blew 85 on the breathalyser, resulting in an arrest for driving over the limit, driving with no insurance and driving whilst being banned.

Observations ended and police radioed thanks to CCTV operators for assistance.

## St Neots shoplifter stole books and gift boxes in pre-Christmas spree


A man from St Neots has been jailed after stealing books and gift boxes from stores in the run-up to Christmas.

Glen Woolford was caught on CCTV targeting Boots and Waterstones, in the High Street, on four occasions between 5 and 23 November.

At Huntingdon Magistrates' Court today (4 December), Woolford, 41, from St Neots, was sentenced to 24 weeks in prison after pleading guilty to four counts of shop theft.

PC Neal Bartley, who investigated, said: "Shoplifting impacts local businesses and the community, especially during the busy Christmas season. Woolford has shown a flagrant disregard for businesses and their property and the sentence reflects how seriously the courts take shop theft. We will continue to work hard to keep towns like St Neots safe."

## Burglar stolen cash from Cambridge restaurant

A burglar who stole cash from a Cambridge restaurant has been jailed.

Jack Wilmot was captured on CCTV breaking into Royal Spice, in Chesterton Road, on 29 October and stealing money from the till.

The 28-year-old, of East Road, also stole 18 bottles of olive oil from Sainsbury's, in Mill Road, between 27 and 28 October and alcohol from Milton Tesco on 20 September.

Wilmot has a Criminal Behaviour Order in place until May 2026 with conditions not to enter any Boots, Co-op, The Perfume Shop, John Lewis, TK Maxx or Sainsbury's in Cambridge.

At Huntingdon Magistrates' Court on Thursday (30 October), Wilmot pleaded guilty to three counts of breaching a CBO, four counts of theft and burglary. He was sentenced to 38 weeks in prison.


PC Samantha Chapman, who investigated, said: "Thanks to clear CCTV evidence and swift investigative work, we were able to bring Wilmot to justice quickly. We hope this sentence sends a clear message that burglary and theft will not be tolerated in our communities."

I have spoken to officers that were there- the operators were very helpful! – the movement between all the difference cameras kept everyone on their toes.



# CCTV COMPLIMENTS

I have just been asked to pass on thanks from police and premises regarding the above incident. The premises advised that the response via the HBAC radio was immediate, which was a huge relief, as the incident was very violent. CCTV managed to track the males, taking the description from the premises via ongoing HBAC radio comms and via police airways. 2 males, who were unknown, due to being from out of area, were promptly arrested. Their injuries amount to GBH and they will be in court in the New Year. The CCTV has already been collected for this incident, and police have expressed their thanks at how swift CCTV was and the coverage available.

Male details have been added to the DISC system, along with a brief description of what happened.








# CCTV CAMERA MAP – CAMBRIDGE CITY AS OF DECEMBER 2025




**Cambridge Cameras** – 434 cameras covering the city centre, Milton and Arbury




# CCTV CAMERA MAP – HUNTINGDON & GODMANCHESTER AS OF DECEMBER 2025






# CCTV CAMERA MAP – ST IVES & HOUGHTON AS OF DECEMBER 2025






# CCTV CAMERA MAP – ST NEOTS AS OF DECEMBER 2025




**St Neots Cameras – 60 cameras**




# CCTV CAMERA MAP – RAMSEY AS OF DECEMBER 2025




**Ramsey Cameras – 14 cameras**




# CCTV CAMERA MAP – YAXLEY AS OF DECEMBER 2025




**Yaxley Cameras – 1 camera**




# CCTV CAMERA MAP – STILTON AS OF DECEMBER 2025


