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WITNESS STATEMENT

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1. I, Georgia Patterson, of Huntingdonshire District Council, am the Community Safety Partnership Officer in Huntingdonshire with a responsibility of chairing the Child Problem Solving Group and linking into to the Adult Problem Solving Group across the district. This group is made up of Local Authority, Police, Housing Associations, Probation/Youth Offending, and relevant support services.
2. I am duly authorised to make this statement on behalf of the Council in support of its application for an injunction. The matters referred to in this statement are within my own knowledge or gained from the file of records in the possession of the Council except where expressly stated otherwise. In so far as the contents are within my personal knowledge, they are true. Otherwise, they are true to the best of my knowledge, information and belief.
3. The Council seeks an injunction to preventing persons unknown
  - 1.) To conduct acts of harassment or verbal abuse towards any persons whilst thought to be engaging in any of the other prohibited activities included in this civil injunction.
  - (2.) To conduct any activities which involve accessing any property with the intent to gain access to stairs and roofs within the area of this civil injunction, without permission of the occupier/owner of the property
  - (3.) To run, jump or climb across rooftops within the area of this civil injunction, without permission of the occupier/owner of the property.
4. The scope of the Child Problem Solving Group is to problem solve together, where a multi-agency approach is necessary to protect our communities; this being to support people (victims and perpetrators) away from crime and disorder and enforce sanctions (criminal or otherwise) on those who choose to harm our communities. Working together, the group will co-ordinate and task the activities around people and places seen as being vulnerable or at risk from harm in Huntingdonshire.

5. Between July 2023 and June 2024, there were 52 police incidents of roof running in St Neots predominantly reported to be young people (ref GP001 in evidence bundle outlines this). From visiting and speaking to business owners in St Neots town centre, it became apparent the physical and financial impact this behaviour is having; Saint's Hairdressing suffered a significant leak, causing their business to close for 2 days due to damage from a dislodged roof tile as a result of roof running (ref GP002). Holland and Barratt, Zero's Barber shop, and The Works are also other affected businesses, with physical damage to their properties shown in GP002 of the evidence bundle.
6. There are several access points to the roofs of these businesses (shown in GP003) where it is accessible to climb from one roof to another. This presents a significant risk of physical harm to those engaging in the behaviour, and Police currently have limited resource to enforce this. Acceptable behaviour contracts have been utilised for identified individuals who are engaging in the behaviour; however roof running is still occurring, with the most recent incident (as this statement is written) reported to Police on 04/09/2024. The use of individual sanctions has not been significant enough to prevent this behaviour, and therefore feel the most appropriate next step is to introduce a person's unknown civil injunction in the area.
7. The Youth Offending Service have been consulted on the civil injunction, and have provided a letter to evidence this on Page 8 of the evidence bundle. Additionally, St Neots Town Council and Huntingdonshire Business Against Crime, and the Huntingdonshire Community Safety Partnership have also provided supporting statements for the introduction of a person's unknown Civil Injunction, which is demonstrated on pages 6, 7 and 9 of the evidence bundle.
8. Cambridgeshire Constabulary, Probation/Youth Offending Services, and the District Council continue to invest a lot of resource into the highlighted community concerns and impact on residents and businesses.

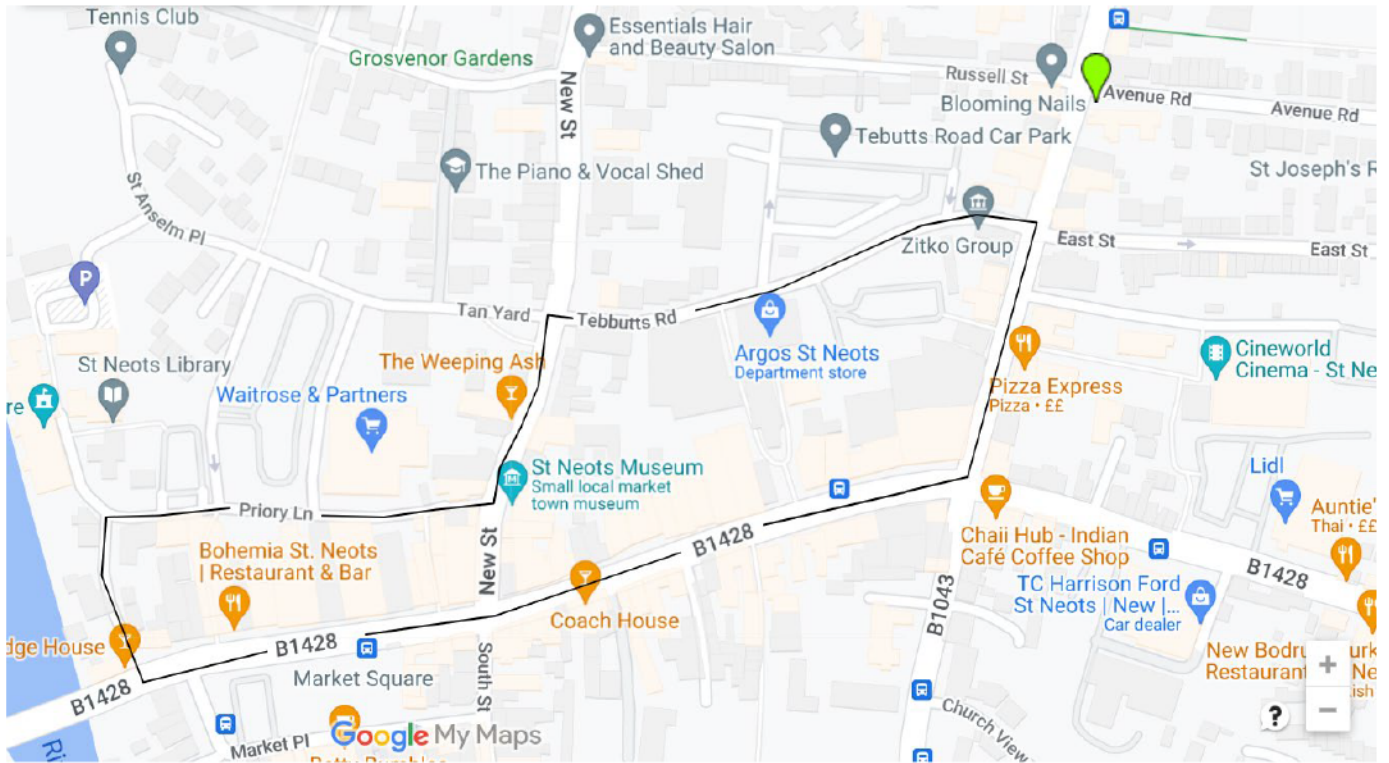

Rationale for Civil Injunction:

Huntingdonshire District Council are proposing a Civil Injunction for St Neots Town Centre in response to a significant number of incidents involving young people climbing onto the roofs of local businesses and causing property damage. In the last 12 months, since July 2023, there have been 52 crimes related to young people accessing the stairs/roofs of premises within St Neots Town Centre. However, from speaking with employees of the businesses within the town centre, this number is likely to be a lot higher.

Young people climbing onto the roofs of businesses poses a risk to their own safety as well as others, but also causes damage to properties which impacts them financially; as such in the case of Saints Hairdressing where their shop was closed for 2 days as a result of a leak which had been caused from a dislodged roof tile.

Shop owners have reported that these incidents have also been accompanied by instances of harassment, alarm and distress directed towards individuals who attempt to intervene. There is currently limited criminal power for police to address roof running effectively, and the proposed Civil Injunction would allow Police to carry additional powers to tackle this issue, enabling a more robust response to prevent further occurrences.

The proposed conditions are the following:

1. Not to conduct acts of harassment or verbal abuse towards any persons whilst thought to be engaging in any of the other prohibited activities included in this civil injunction.
2. Not to conduct any activities which involve accessing any property with the intent to gain access to stairs and roofs within the area of this civil injunction, without permission of the occupier/owner of the property
3. Not to run, jump or climb across rooftops within the area of this civil injunction, without permission of the occupier/owner of the property.

In the first instance of an individual breaching the civil injunction, they will be expected to write a letter of apology to the victim. In the second instance of an individual breaching the civil injunction, a referral to diversion services will be completed and the young person will be expected to engage with this. In the third instance, court action will be sought.

There are 5 letters of support contained within this bundle; the St Neots Neighbourhood Policing Team Sargeant Rob Streater, St Neots Town Council, Youth Offending Service, Huntingdonshire Business Against Crime and the Huntingdonshire Community Safety Partnership; all of which have been impacted by the roof running behaviours in St Neots.

Dear Georgia,

I am writing to you to formally request that HDC consider the evidence which has been collated in respect of ongoing instances of Anti-Social Behaviour within the town of St Neots for the purpose of obtaining a civil injunction.

The conditions of the civil injunction if granted would apply to the rooftops of the businesses premises within the town centre of St Neots along the high street and would be for the purpose of preventing people (in particular youth) gaining access to the rooftops of the business premises.

The basis of this request is down to the groups that are attending causing damage to the rooftops by removing roof tiles, gaining access to properties through the rooftop doorways and issues such as storage generators being turned off causing significant loss of stock within refrigerated units of the businesses. We then have to consider the safety implications of people gaining access to the rooftops where there is no established safety routes or protective equipment to minimise the chance of an accident occurring or worse still a death taking place due to a slip or fall.

I have considered the likely location for displacement of this ASB should a civil injunction be obtained and believe that riverside Park, St Neots would be the obvious choice particularly when the weather is better as there is no obvious area where rooftop access would be available other than the town centre itself if access is prevented moving forward. However having given it consideration it is felt that this area is large enough to accommodate congregation of numerous groups without effecting locals in a manner that would disrupt their day to day lives and would also ensure the safety of the groups being targeted as they would not be at height.

I am hoping that two issues can be addressed in one with the carefully considered use of a civil injunction , these being:

**ASB which is associated with disruption, and damage of the rooftops through unwanted access.**

Such behaviours reported include: damage to the rooftops through roof tiles being removed, unwanted access to properties being obtained, and due to generators being turned off loss of stock from refrigerated units of some of the businesses.

**Safety of the individuals concerned.** Such behaviours reported include: people gaining access to the roofs and sitting/ standing/ running very close to the edge of the roof line which is causing fear and worry with members of the public going about their business on the pavements below.

As you can see there is significant cross over with the types of ASB and concerns involved, hence my assertion that a well worded civil injunction could address all the types of conduct taking place without impeding any legitimate use of the roof top spaces. I have included behaviours which are frequently reported to Police as of concern to the public but which will sometimes fall outside of criminal legislation and as such Police are not equipped to address with their warranted powers.

As a constabulary we fully support the use of a civil injunction to cover the roof top areas of shops and businesses along the high street of st neots and I look forward to working with you to address these concerns.

The Town Council is aware of issues around trespassing and damage to property which creates challenges for businesses and results in risks to both the public and perpetrators of the antisocial behaviour.


The Council supports any action which provides Cambs Police with more power to address incidents arising, particularly the conditions set out below;

**Multi Agency ASB Problem Solving Group**

**Ref – Roof Runners, St Neots Town Centre**

I am Rob Mitchell and I have the responsibility of chairing the district-wide multi-agency Problem Solving Group (PSG). This group is made up of Local Authority, Police, Housing Associations, Probation, and relevant Support Services.

- The scope of the group is to problem solve together, where a multi-agency approach is necessary to protect our communities; this being to support people (victims and perpetrators) away from crime and disorder and enforce sanctions (criminal or otherwise) on those who choose to harm our communities.
- Working together, the group will co-ordinate and task the activities around people and places seen as being vulnerable or at risk from harm in Huntingdonshire.

In the previous 12 months, there have been reports of individuals carrying out acts of roof running over the top of commercial properties within St Neots Town centre. After carrying out community and business visits, the initial problems have grown in impact and reach across the location. Business owners have identified and supplied evidence of damage where individuals had accessed their private property to gain access to the roof area.

There are also significant safeguarding concerns for the individuals carrying out this behaviour. The local policing team have conducted patrols and spoken to some young people, but this hasn't reduced the behaviours. The belief is that there are several groups conducting this activity. In partnership, HDC have also developed links with Huntingdonshire Business Against crime and St Neots Town Council, who have also provided statements on this matter and are included in the evidence bundle. These partnerships were formed to improve at-risk locations, and incident information.

As the issue has escalated to involve multiple groups of individuals, HDC and its partners have been unable to identify all of those involved and therefore cannot tackle the issue wholly through the use of relevant sanctions. With the commercial premises being private property, we feel the most appropriate next step to reduce the incidents is to apply for a 'Persons Unknown' Injunction, with powers of arrest to demonstrate the severity and risk of this activity.

Cambridgeshire Constabulary, Probation and the District Council continue to invest a lot of resource into the highlighted community concerns and impact on residents and businesses.

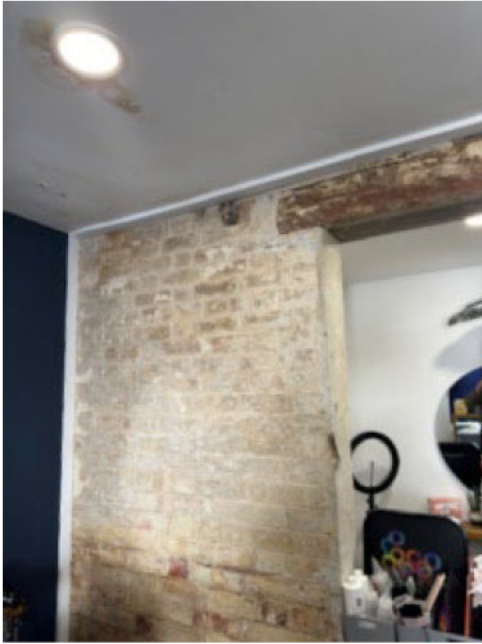

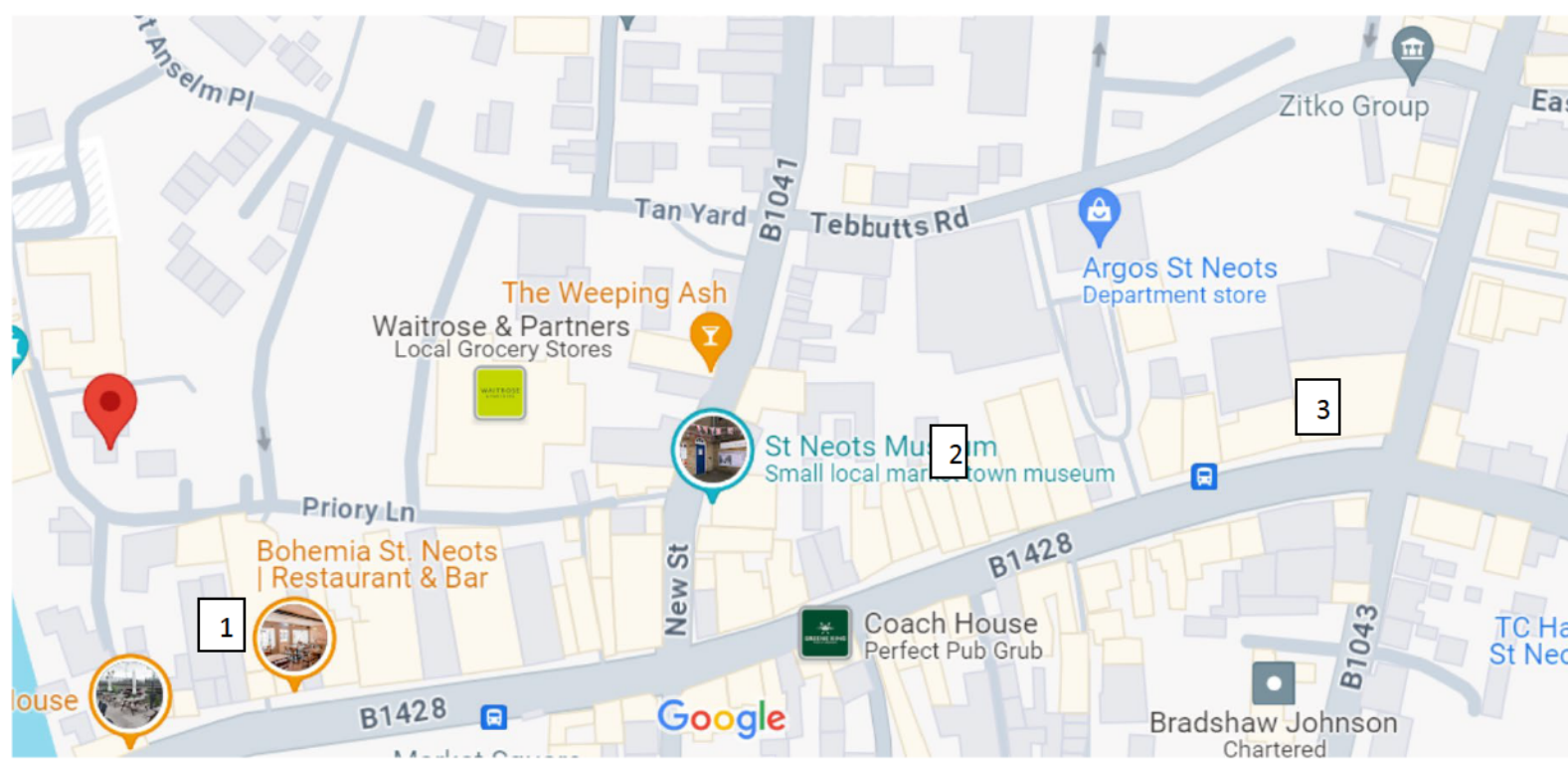
